

ASPIRE PROJECT OVERVIEW - MAHARASHTRA

Intensifying and Integrating Actions in Aspirational Districts

Overview:

Revitalization and reorientation of health care services are required for health promotion, disease prevention, early detection, and integrated care, particularly at the primary care level. PPHF with support from national Health Mission, Maharashtra and Sanofi India will work towards health systems strengthening for the early detection and management of NCDs and their risk factors. Actions under this area will cater to strengthen health systems, particularly the primary health care system. The goal of the program is to meet the primary health care needs of the underprivileged population in the PHC area.

Objectives:

1. Build the capacity of PHC health team to deliver essential NCD services
2. Increased public awareness on NCDs through health education and promotion on critical health issues in the community
3. Strengthen implementation of NCD population-based screening guidelines at the PHC
4. Establish linkages between Ayushman Bharat Insurance schemes for improving treatment adherence

Program approach:

We intend to demonstrate the proposed interventions in both the of Maharashtra. Complete implementation of the proposed actions in this area will lead to improve access to health-care services, increase competence of primary health care workers, referral mechanism, and empowerment of communities and individuals for self-care and treatment adherence

For effective community actions and improved diagnosis of NCDs. We will adopt the following strategies:

1. Capacity building of health teams and primary physicians.
2. Community awareness call to action drive for screening.
3. Digital solution for patient records and follow ups
4. Establishing the referral mechanism and linking the identified cases under Ayushman Bharat scheme for treatment adherence
5. Develop Peer to Peer support groups.
6. Advocacy for scaling up
